Bhutia is one of the regional languages of the state. Initially Bhutia languages was taught in government colleges as MIL (Morden Indian Language) under North Bengal University. Later the same language got introduced as elective subject in government colleges under Sikkim Central University from 2008. The department was run by single faculty till that time. In the course of time Sikkim University became fully operational and 3 regional languages were introduced as honors course from 2012 onwards. Today bhutia language department is a dedicated department of Sikkim Government College Namchi with three faculties.

Today Bhutia is one of the official languages of Sikkim State with the adoption of Sikkim state language Bill 1977. The Sikkim states Assembly recognized the three languages that is Bhutia, Lepcha and Nepali as the state languages of Sikkim. In fact, it was a big challenge for text book writers to prepare text books for initial stage in the Government school in Sikkim. Mr. Norden Tshering Bhutia Assistant Director (Languages) Department of Education, Government of Sikkim approved first Bhutia text book according to the principles of modern languages, teaching and instruction. Attempt was made to write the text book with illustrations and pictures etc.

In the subsequent years Mr. Pema Rikzing Takchungdarpa also joined text book section of education department and prepared Bhutia text books to be taught in Government schools in the state.

Gradually the same language was upgraded and introduced up to Jr High school, Higher secondary school and senior secondary school across the state. Bhutia text books were developed and made available for the readers and students in the schools. In the course of time many Bhutia linguist came forward and involved in designing and writing Bhutia text books, story books, Bhutia poetry, Bhutia Novel books, Bhutia Grammar etc.

Today Bhutia text book section (languages) is fully functional under the Directorate of languages in the Education department, Government of Sikkim. The Directorate is headed by Director, Additional Director, Joint Director, Senior text book Officer and Assistant education officer AEO.

The Bhutia language section is functioning under the Senior Text Book officer Mr. Yeshi Rikzing Bhutia in the Directorate of languages Education department Government of Sikkim, Gangtok.

We have some prominent figures in developing Bhutia Languages over the past 46 years including Mr. Norden Tshering Bhutia (Padmashree) retired as Director Education Government of Sikkim.




Report on Bhutia Department Dance Performance at Nepali Bhasa Diwas
